<b>A</b> UTHORITY	Is the name of the author listed on the website? What kind of website is this (.edu, .gov, .com, .org)? If the author is a company or organization, is it reputable?  Does the author have any degrees or credentials? *Google the author if you don't know*	Author is a student or no author is listed.  -or-  Webpage is a .com or .org with no reputable author.	The author's name is present, but they have no credentials.	The author is listed, and they have credentials, but not in the area of the content they wrote about.  -and- Site is a .gov, .edu, or reputable organization.	The author has credentials that verify they are an expert in the field of the content you are reading.
<b>P</b> OINT OF VIEW	Why was this website created: to inform you, to convince you, to sell you something?  Does the website present both sides of an argument in a non-biased way?  Does this website have any sort of social or political affiliation (conservative/liberal, pro-life/pro-choice, etc)?	The purpose is personal to the author, or the site exists to sell you something.	Purpose is mainly to sell, persuade, or has biased information, but some of the information is factual.	Offers factual information, but may not be totally free of bias.	Purpose is to support research and learning. The information is balanced and strives to avoid bias.
TOTAL POINTS	YOUR SCORE MEANS  0 to 3: Highly questionable resource – AVOID  4 to 6: Useful for getting ideas or finding terms, but don't use this is a resource for a paper.  7 to 9: Generally a good source for a paper, but check with your instructor if in doubt.  10 to 12: Excellent source for a paper.
